



# Walker Dial-a-Ride and Reds Meadow Shuttle Service Changes

Date: May 13, 2020

A public meeting is scheduled for June 12, 2020, at 9:30am. The details of the meeting are listed in the Public Notice issued May 13, 2020. Two items are up for comment:

1. Cancelling Tuesday Walker DAR in exchange for a Walker to Mammoth Lakes Route. The new route would leave Walker at 8:30am and serve Bridgeport, Mono City, Lee Vining, and June Lake before arriving in Mammoth at 10:15am. Passengers would have till 3:15pm to conduct business before leaving Mammoth Lakes and returning. All points in between are available for passengers. Service would be by reservation only. The draft schedule for the new route looks like this:

Adult/Discount Fares

A ten-ride pass would be available that includes a 10% discount. If approved, the new route would begin in July or August 2020. 2. Cancellation of the 2020 Reds Meadow Shuttle. Limited load requirements and logistical challenges relating to Covid-19 prompted the cancellation of this year's shuttle.
